



**JUSTIFICATION FOR THE CONFERRAL OF THE
GRAND LEGACY LAUREATE OF PUBLIC SERVICE (GLLPS)
UPON ARC SONNY SUNDAY ECHONO**

I. Preamble: The Standard of the Grand Legacy Laureate of Public Service

The Grand Legacy Laureate of Public Service (GLLPS) represents the highest class of recognition conferred by the Institute for Historical Studies, Biographical Research, Documentation and Legacy (IHS-BiRD & L). It is reserved for individuals whose record demonstrates institutional leadership, measurable public sector transformation, policy continuity, and enduring contribution to national development.

The Institute's evaluation framework is guided by its core principles:

- **Truth first** – recognition grounded in verifiable institutional record;
- **Guardians of memory** – preservation of contributions with enduring national significance;
- **Justice through legacy** – acknowledgement of transformational public service often underrepresented in historical documentation;
- **History for growth** – identification of leadership models worthy of institutional study and public emulation.

The conferral of the Grand Legacy Laureate of Public Service upon Arc Sonny Sunday Echono rests upon documented administrative leadership, education sector reform, institutional modernization, infrastructural expansion, digital transformation, and strategic repositioning of the Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund) within Nigeria's higher education ecosystem since his assumption of office as Executive Secretary in March 2022.

II. Foundation of Administrative and Policy Competence

Arc Sonny Echono's public service trajectory reflects sustained progression through Nigeria's federal administrative architecture. Trained as an architect and public administrator, his career combined technical expertise with institutional governance across multiple ministries and agencies of government.

Prior to his appointment as Executive Secretary of TETFund in March 2022, he served in several strategic capacities within the Federal Civil Service, including Permanent Secretary positions in key ministries such as:

- the Federal Ministry of Education;
- the Federal Ministry of Communications and Digital Economy;
- the Federal Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development;
- and senior administrative roles within the Federal Ministry of Water Resources.

These appointments established a broad administrative foundation spanning education policy, infrastructure governance, procurement management, digital transformation, agricultural institutional administration, and public sector modernization.

Federal Ministry of Education: Educational Governance and Sustainable Funding Reform

These experiences later influenced his infrastructure-focused reforms and project supervision philosophy at TETFund.

Federal Ministry of Communications and Digital Economy: Administrative Coordination During ICT Expansion

Arc Echono also served as Permanent Secretary during a significant phase of Nigeria's telecommunications and digital governance expansion.

This period coincided with accelerated national emphasis on:

- ICT infrastructure development;
- broadband expansion;
- digital policy implementation;
- e-governance frameworks;
- and institutional modernization within the communications sector.

Although policy direction was driven at ministerial level, the Office of the Permanent Secretary coordinated administrative implementation frameworks necessary for programme execution and institutional continuity.

His exposure to ICT governance and digital administrative systems during this period contributed significantly to his later emphasis on:

As Permanent Secretary of the Federal Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development, Arc Echono served during a period of intensified federal emphasis on:

- Advancement of the National Research Fund framework and promotion of solution-oriented research addressing agriculture, health, engineering, technology, manufacturing, and socio-economic development challenges within Nigeria;
- Introduction of digital modernization measures within TETFund operations, including electronic monitoring systems, automated administrative processes, digitized intervention management frameworks, and technology-driven compliance systems designed to improve transparency and institutional efficiency;
- Intensification of project supervision, compliance verification, consultant oversight, and quality assurance mechanisms aimed at improving construction standards, reducing abandoned projects, and ensuring timely completion of TETFund-funded projects nationwide;
- Expansion of academic staff development programmes through postgraduate scholarship support, conference participation interventions, publication assistance, research funding, and institutional capacity-building initiatives designed to strengthen teaching quality and academic competitiveness;
- Promotion of employability-focused and innovation-driven tertiary education policies aimed at strengthening entrepreneurship, technical skills acquisition, industry collaboration, local content development, and graduate preparedness within Nigeria's knowledge economy;
- Sustained administrative leadership within Nigeria's Federal Civil Service across multiple ministries prior to his appointment as Executive Secretary of TETFund,

demonstrating broad institutional competence in governance, education administration, infrastructure management, digital modernization, and policy coordination.

These are not ceremonial accomplishments. They represent measurable institutional reform, educational development, administrative modernization, and strategic public sector leadership within one of Nigeria's most consequential educational intervention agencies.

The GLLPS is reserved for individuals whose documented record reflects enduring contribution to institutional growth and national advancement. The documentary evidence demonstrates that Arc Sonny Sunday Echono has strengthened tertiary education intervention systems, expanded research and infrastructure development, advanced institutional modernization, and reinforced accountability mechanisms within Nigeria's higher education sector.
